Dignity Conventions are a great time to meet new friends and renew old friendships in a convivial, rejuvenating atmosphere that bespeaks the inherent spirituality and hopefulness of GLBT Catholics.

The Austin Convention Committee is planning a whole range of fun, exciting, spiritual and inspirational events for attendees. And, if the 'round-the-clock convention activities weren't enough, the City of Austin, being a government and university town, and thus, uniquely liberal for Texas, offers a plethora of sightseeing venues and entertaining nightlife.

Among the one dozen-plus speakers and presenters are inspirational and prominent leaders, such as:

Sister Jeannine Gramick—One of the founders of New Ways Ministry, she has been on the world stage

by refusing Vatican directives to be silenced in her ministry to gays and lesbians, practicing a form of civil disobedience while remaining a religious sister. The co-author of several books on living as a Catholic and GLBT person and the focus of the movie "In Good Conscience", Sister Gramick is a well-known part of the Dignity family.

Bishop John Shelby Spong—Retired Episcopalian Bishop of Newark and author of 14 books, Bishop Spong is known in the GLBT community for his "Catechesis on Homosexuality" and is a dynamic speaker. His determined emphasis on the gospel of Jesus being a message of love makes him powerful in the fray of political church bickering. Bishop Spong will be both a keynote speaker and breakout speaker.

John McNeill—Well known for his books on Catholicism and homosexuality, John is a beloved member of the Dignity family and a speaker at almost every national Dignity convention. John is author of "The Church and the Homosexual", "Taking a Chance on God", and "Freedom, Glorious Freedom", and "Homosexuality and Spirituality". A Jesuit priest for many years, John remains a model of a "contemplative in action."

Linda Pieczynski—A former president of Call to Action, Linda is deeply connected to the reform movement in the Catholic Church, including issues such as women's ordination and the effects of the sex abuse crisis. Linda, who will celebrate her 35th wedding anniversary during the weekend of the convention, is dedicated to making the institutional church stretch in reaction to the real lives of people.

Daniel Helminiak—Although Daniel is the author of many scholarly works in academic theology, he is perhaps best known in the GLBT community for his much simpler but necessary book written while he was living in Austin , "What the Bible *Really* Says about Homosexuality."
