St. Ignatius is a new Catholic community that has begun to organize. We celebrated our first liturgy in December. For now, mass is celebrated once a month, at 1:00 p.m. on the first Sunday of each month, at Ravenna United Methodist Church. As we grow, additional Sunday celebrations will be added.

St. Ignatius is an open and affirming community, and the only distinction that we recognize is based on need. The plan is to affiliate with the Ecumenical Catholic Communion. The ECC is a large and growing group of parishes and communities across the United States. Its mission statement is: We are People of God baptized in Christ and professing our faith in a living Catholic tradition. We are men and women, lay and ordained, joining together as a "communion of communities" in response to the messianic call of the Spirit to preach the Gospel of liberation and justice; to offer a refuge in Christ for those who suffer prejudice; to stand open to dialogue with others so called and, to conform our lives to the life and teachings of the Lord Jesus Christ.

All are welcome to join with us in establishing and growing this new Catholic community. We especially welcome those who feel that they have been made unwelcome at the Eucharistic meal in the Roman tradition. We are also looking forward to those who will offer their talents to help us grow and to celebrate our Catholic Christian faith. As a community, we seek to faithfully follow the prophetic injunction of Micah, to do right and to love goodness and to walk humbly with God.

Bishop Patricia Friesen's Visit

Bishop Patricia Friesen spoke in Seattle on November 11 and concelebrated a mass on November 12. Her visit was sponsored by Call to Action Western Washington. She spoke of a long journey into awareness of the evils of apartheid in her native South Africa. As a Dominican nun, she and her community found the social system to be incompatible with Christian values and teachings on social justice. In their schools and ministries, they found ways to challenge it, and discovered the liberation they achieved when all were free. She told this story as a way to help her audience understand the journey she has made to ordination, first as a priest and then as a bishop. As have a number of women before her, she was ordained a Roman Catholic priest by an active Roman Catholic bishop whose identity is secret because of his official standing in that church. She was ordained a bishop in a similar manner in recognition of her strengths to lead and inspire others by preaching the gospel.

She concelebrated mass with another female priest from British Columbia, an American Catholic Church priest and a Lutheran minister. Over 75 people attended and participated actively. She demonstrated by her words and actions that the Eucharistic table is truly set for a banquet and that all are welcome.

She greatly enjoyed her time in Seattle and was generous in talking to many people about her mission and hopes for the future. She plans to return here soon. She also reported that there are several women in British Columbia and in Oregon who are preparing for ordination through Roman Catholic Women Priests. Hopefully her visit inspired others to hear the call of the Holy Spirit. \bigvee
