

Father J. Paul Dalton December 4, 1951—February 29, 2008



Our beloved brother and priest died suddenly on February 29, 2008. Father Paul was born to Jim and Marie Dalton on December 4, 1951. Ordained as a priest for the Catholic Archdiocese of Seattle on November 11, 1978, he served many parishes in the Northwest, including: St. Therese - Seattle, St. Michael's

Olympia, Assumption - Bellingham, Our Lady of Guadalupe - Seattle, Mary Queen of Peace - Sammamish, and Holy Disciples - Puyallup. Father Paul also supported and cared for his L'Arche Community friends, served as a chaplain and facilitated retreats for the Faith and Light community in Bellingham and Seattle, celebrated Mass for the Dignity Community of Seattle, and actively supported Habitat for Humanity, Walk for Life, and people with AIDS.

Paul was truly a beloved pastor and friend to countless people and was cherished by all who knew him. He was the "baby brother" and family handyman, leaving each member with cherished memories of his expert craftsmanship. Whenever there was a special occasion, Paul offered his culinary expertise with chocolate mousse chiffon cake, flambé spinach salad, pumpkin and pecan pies, pork tenderloin with apricot sauce, and other delicacies. He will be remembered for his distinctive laugh, his compassion and care for others, his humble and unassuming manner, and for always loving and supporting his family.

He will be very much missed by his siblings, Denny (Sharon) Dalton, Fr. Jim Dalton, Marilyn (Dean) Messmer, Susie (Bruce) Simner, and Michael (Terry) Dalton, and many nieces and nephews.


