From Equal Rights Washington

Every two years over a thousand LGBT and allied Washingtonians come to Olympia to lobby and educate their legislators and show public support for LGBT civil rights.

We'll be sending more information including sponsorship information about Equality Day 2011 by mid-January. Now is the time to let your congregations, civic organizations and friends and family know about the date.

For those unfamiliar with Equality Day, the morning includes an issue briefing and lobby training, followed by a noontime rally on the front steps of the State Capitol. The early afternoon is spent lobbying and educating legislators.

For those unable to attend Equality Day in Olympia, action alerts and other opportunities will provide meaningful ways of participating in Equality Day from afar. And for those traveling from far away there will be online video lobby and issue briefings in advance so you can arrive later in the day and still have the information you need!

How do we live faithful lives in demanding times? This is a question that each of us faces, as we struggle to maintain hope in our wounded world. Our culture is fragmented, our churches are polarized, and our hearts grow weary. Many are simply choosing to withdraw into their private world of survival. But this would be a tragic mistake. Often it is precisely during a time of chaos that the gospel promise of transformation unfolds in new ways. One of the contemporary signs of this transforming spirit is the global hunger for equality and the deepening commitment to solidarity across all political, religious, and cultural boundaries. This is justice rising. In this day of reflection, we invite you to reclaim your hope—to commit yourself again to being part of God's fierce love as it rises in human consciousness.

Presenters: Fran Ferder, FSPA, PhD, DMin, and John Heagle, MA, JCL, LMHC, are the co-directors of Therapy & Renewal Associates (TARA), a counseling and renewal resource in the Pacific Northwest. They also teach ecumenical graduate courses in the theology of human sexuality and communication. They are internationally recognized leaders of workshops and conferences, authors of several articles, tapes, and books on spirituality, ministry, and human relationships, including their book, Tender Fires: The Spiritual Promise of Sexuality (Crossroad, 2002). Fran's latest book is Enter the Story: Biblical Metaphors for Our Lives (Orbis Books, 2010). John's new book, Justice Rising: The Emerging Biblical Vision (2010), is also published by Orbis Books.
