Dignity/Seattle's President's Report, 2015 - 2016

Our roster stands at 21 active members.

We continued to meet for liturgy on the second Sunday of each month through June. Gary S was unable to preside for us this year, so Paula H prepared and led services centered around prayer and discussion of the Sunday readings. Attendance has really dropped. There were a couple of times when Paula and I were the only attendees. Thank you to Paula for taking over the responsibility for coordination of the liturgy and for continuing to provide great music to help those in attendance to celebrate.

Our quarterly birthday/anniversary celebrations continued this year. Our fourth quarter 2015 celebration was a potluck and holiday party held at Ravenna UMC. We collected toys for Toys for Tots and Laure again donated some light balls she made that were auctioned off, with the money raised going to Toys for Tots. The first and second quarters of 2016 were celebrated at Julia's and McMenamins restaurants. These places were chosen in thanks for their support of our Pride raffle. The third quarter was once again our annual picnic at Woodland Park. Thank you to Alan for reserving a shelter and coordinating the food. Thank you to everyone who attended and celebrated with us.

We continued to volunteer at Food Lifeline until they closed the Shoreline warehouse in April. We helped to repack bulk food items into smaller packages for distribution at various Western Washington food banks. Six to eight members and friends met every other month to work. We are looking at moving our volunteer day to Saturday since the new warehouse is in south Seattle.

We celebrated our 28th Annual Pride Week Breakfast in June. Proceeds were a bit lower this year, but we were still able to donate \$650 each to CareTeams-a Program of Samaritan Center (the organization that took over Rosehedge and MultiFaith Works) and to Food Lifeline. The remainder we put into a convention scholarship fund to help get our members to the DignityUSA National Conference in Boston in 2017. Thank you to all who worked so hard to make this breakfast another success.

This year we had the opportunity to help pack school backpacks for the children at Mary's Place. Our chapter purchased 50 flash drives that were put into the backpacks for the high school students. Working with other organizations we were able to pack and donate nearly 200 backpacks for the homeless children.

We really are in need of some serious discussion on the future of Dignity/Seattle. With our liturgy attendance down to practically nothing, and our social events also seeing dwindling attendance, we need to decide where we are, and where we need to go in the future. We cannot continue to just roll along. We need to seriously look at who and what we are and could or should be. These decisions cannot just be made by the board of directors. We need each and every member to get involved in the deliberations. We will be sending out information and opportunities to share in the coming months. Please get involved.

I would like to thank our board of directors for their continued leadership and commitment to Dignity/Seattle. Thank you Laure, Delia, Alan and Paula H. And of course, a very special thank you to Leo for continuing to be our newsletter editor and keeping us all aware of what is happening locally and nationally in our community.

I look forward to a new year and new opportunities for Dignity/Seattle. I welcome any suggestions or input from members and friends.
